He also had attempted to cash the check at some of the stores but none had sufficient funds on hand to cash the check. Mr. Duff was told of the check incident and immediately

phoned to Grace City and found that the car was in a garage there being repaired and that the men were still in town. The car was seized and the men arrested. It proved to be three in the outfit, one Chas. Weston, who has been working for Mr. Duff during the summer, and his two nephews young Holmes and the other party whose name we have not been able to learn. It was quite evident that the crime was instigated by Weston, who it seems was infatuated with a desire to possess the Haynes car, as he had told Mr. Duff on several occasions that he would like to own the car.

and got the car and the prisoners, the latter being taken to Valley City where it is presumed that they will plead guilty to the charge and receive their sentences.
