More Charges Against Jacobson

George Jacobson, president of the closed Walum State Bank, arrested some time ago charged with embezzling about \$7,000 in connection with his handling of the bank's finances, has been re-arrested upon demand of one of his bondsmen, and is now held on three other complaints in addition to the original one filed by Mr. Nelson, a farmer. The complaints are all of a similar nature.

It is charged Jacobson misappropriated moneys, that he secured renewal notes and failed to return the old notes, that he secured the signatures of the bank patrons to guarantees upon which the bank raised money, and that he robbed safety deposit boxes, taking Liberty bonds and other papers.
