TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 1920**Proclamation**

Whereas, In Asia Minor the native, Christian inhabitants have been deported, massacred and driven into the desert to starve, resulting in the death of some 800,000 children alone, as well as adults, and

Whereas, 250,000 children of Armenia, Syria and Greece are homeless and wholly dependent upon outside sources for a chance to live, and they can look only to America, and

Whereas, North Dakota has been apportioned 1500 of these little dependents, and whatever relief they receive must come from our people, and

Whereas, The Act of Congress of August 6, 1919, authorized the Near East Relief to provide succor for these worthy people,

Now, Therefore, In order that a concerted effort may be made to raise funds to aid these needy unfortunates, I hereby designate Monday, October 4th, as RELIEF DAY and urge that all possible assistance be given those in charge of the campaign that North Dakota may once more "go over the top" for the cause of humanity.
