
Nolan Held To District Court

At the hearing before Nels P. Nelson, Justice of the Peace, at Cooperstown, Friday afternoon, F. W. Nolan, was charged with murder in the first degree for shooting Joseph Bagley near the coal chute here, October 2nd. A charge of assault with intent to kill was first lodged against Nolan, but this was dismissed by States Attorney Sad and the new charge preferred when Bagley died from his wounds at St. John's hospital, Oct. 5th.

Nolan, who has C. J. Murphy, of Grafton, for his attorney, waived preliminary examination and was held to the district court which will set in November.

Fourteen witnesses were subpoenaed by the state, a majority of them being Bagley's pals who were with him at the time of the shooting.

That the case is given much attention was evidenced by the fact that the courtroom Friday afternoon was filled to capacity by citizens from all parts of the county who had gathered to hear the details of the affair, though it was generally believed that the hearing would be waived.
