

Mrs. Ole Helmer, aged 62 years, died at her home northeast of town, Friday, July 30, of cancer. Mrs. Helmer, nee Sigrid Kristine Johanson, was born July 30, 1853, at Drangdal, Norway. She was married at that place on October 12, 1880, to Ole Helmer. Three years later they emigrated to the United States and located in Minnesota, coming from there to Griggs county about thirty years ago, and where they have since made their home. Funeral services were held at the home at 1 p. m., Aug. 3rd, Rev. Sigurd Olsen officiating. Interment was made in the Union Church cemetery. The Union choir rendered special selections at the house and also at the cemetery. The large concourse of friends and the many beautiful flowers attested in the best possible manner to the high esteem in which the deceased was held by all who knew her. The precipitation was 2.22 inches, the greatest rainfall for a single day occurring on July 15 when .52 of an inch fell. There were 19 clear days during the July just past. There were seven partially cloudy days and five days when the sun failed to put in an appearance. There were three thunder storms, on July 8, 10 and 15.
