## Mrs. Christ Jackson

Mrs. Ingeborg Vesta Jackson passed away Saturday afternoon, Aug. 12th, at her home in Mabel township. Mrs. Jackson was born in Siljord, Telemarken, Norway, Nov. 14th, 1863, and came first to Coon Valley, Wis., in 1887, and three years later to Cooperstown, N. D.

She was the wife of Christ Jackson, one of our county's pioneers, and had resided here for twenty-six years. She had been ailing for a number of years, and especially the last two years had her health been failing fast. After consulting medical aid at different places, she finally went to Mayos at Rochester, where she was told she had incurable cancer of the stomach and liver. She came home and after three months, which were spent the greater part of the time in bed, passed away.

She leaves besides her husband two sons and two daughters, Johnny, Melvin and Charlotte, who are all at home on the farm, and Mrs. Bert Starr of Sutton. Also a brother at Osseo, Wis. The husband and children were all at the bedside to the last and will miss a faithful wife and loving mother.

The funeral occurred Monday afternoon. Short services were conducted at the house by Rev. P. A. Thoreson and a quartette sang a song. The services were continued at the Mabel Lutheran church, of which she had been a member, where Rev. Thoreson preached the funeral sermon, and Rev. Hewson of Dover also gave a short speech. The remains were interred in the church cemetery.

The floral offerings were many and beautiful and the host of friends present showed the great esteem in which the deceased was held.

With the demise of Mrs. Jackson, Mabel congregation lost a staunch and true member, and Mabel Ladies Aid an interested and willing worker.
