

# Mrs. A. B. Judge

Ellen Louise Allen was born near Godrich, Ontario, October 13, 1870, and passed to her reward at Hannaford, N. Dak., October 20th, 1917, at the age of 47 years and seven days, after an illness of more than a year with cancer. When nine years of age she came with her parents to Goodhue County, Minn., where she lived till she came to Casselton, N. D., in the year 1892, from whence she moved to Hannaford.

On January 29th, 1889, she was married to James D. Wilcox to which union was born one child, Allene, now Mrs. Gile Kinder. Mr. Wilcox died May 12, 1895. On March 26, 1902, she was united in marriage to Mr. A. B. Judge, of Casselton, N. Dak., to which union were born five children, Lyle, Eugene, Mary and Barnard, and an infant who was called to its heavenly home at the age of seventeen days.

In addition to the immediate family, she leaves a mother, Mrs. Allen, of Chicago, two sisters, Mrs. May Hayes of Chicago, and Mrs. F. F. Gill of Wheatland, N. Dak., as well as a large company of friends at the various places she has lived.

About twenty-five years ago she became a member of the Presbyterian church of Casselton, where she kept her membership till about a year ago when she became a member of the Presbyterian church of Hannaford. During her last hours of affliction it seemed that her faith was increased. She fought her battles well with the reaper of death and we trust she can now say:

"There is no death, what seems so  
is transition,

This life of mortal breath  
Is but the suburb of the life Elysian  
Whose portals we call death."

The remains were taken to Casselton Monday for interment.
