

Ole Paulson

Last week we printed a brief notice that Ole Paulson of Sutton had passed away at Fargo late Saturday evening, March 10. The cause of his death was the bursting of a blood vessel in the brain. The remains were taken to Sutton and the funeral took place last Thursday. Brief funeral services were conducted in the English language in the church at Sutton by Rev. P. A. Thoreson of Hannaford. The remains were then taken to the Mabel Lutheran church where services were conducted in Norwegian by Rev. Thoreson and where interment took place in the adjoining cemetery.

Deceased was fifty-one years old. He came to Griggs county from Rockland, Wis., about twenty years ago and has resided in the neighborhood of Sutton ever since. He was employed as farm manager successively by Rollef Berg, Hans Lien and A. J. Anderson. During the last few years he has been with Adolph Kjelson. He was an unusually trustworthy and competent man. A few years ago he bought a house in Sutton, which he fitted out as a comfortable home for his aged mother.

An unusually large number of people attended the funeral. Mr. Paulson has a large number of acquaintances, and to know him was to respect him. Rev. Thoreson very fittingly in his sermons emphasized the qualities which made Mr. Paulson so universally beloved and respected as a man and a friend.

Ole Paulson made ample provision for the wants of his aged mother, who resides at Sutton. Two younger brothers make their home with her. Besides these two, there are two brothers residing in Hettinger county of this state, and three brothers in Wisconsin.
