Iver Skaar, one of the old settlers of Dover township, died at his home on Tuesday, July 17, at 6:00 o'clock p. m. after an illness of about two years' duration. He had sought relief from his affliction, anæmia, with specialists both at Fargo and Rochester without avail, his sufferings finally coming to an end last Tuesday.

Deceased was fifty-three years of age; came to Griggs county in 1885 from Dane county, Wisconsin, and located on a homestead in Dover township. Together with his brother, Edmund, who died about five years ago, he farmed a large tract of land in Dover.

He married Emma, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Everson, and is survived by the widow and six children, Leonard, Albert, Martin, Mrs. Clarice Hopeland, Knut and Oscar. A sister, Mrs. Slotten, resides at Belyille, Wis.

The funeral was held last Friday from the home, Rev. P. A. Thoreson conducting the services. The remains were interred in Eldfjord cemetery under the rites of the Lutheran church.
