## Miss Lauder May Leave This Fall to Do Hospital Work in France

The following article refers to Miss Frances Lauder who was formerly employed as a teacher in the Hannaford public school:

Miss Frances Lauder, daughter of Judge and Mrs. W. S. Lauder of Wahpeton, will be among the first North Dakota girls to go to the war zone in France. She is at present in Jefferson Hospital in Philadelphia taking a course in first aid and hygiene which will enable her to receive a diploma as a nurse's aide.

Miss Lauder is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and has been taking a post graduate course this year at Bryn Mawr. Mrs. Gibson, a wealthy Philadelphia woman and her brother, Dr. Henry, have donated to the government a 500-bed hospital, the equipment for which is being assembled. The corps is to be known as Jefferson unit No. 38 and will be in charge of Dr. Henry.

A number of Bryn Mawr students are to be members of the unit, including several close friends of Miss Lauder. The unit is to leave in October and Miss Lauder is planning to visit at her home in Wahpeton before her departure.

Eastern papers have given much space in their feature and pictorial columns to the Bryn Mawr farm, operated almost entirely by the women students and designed as an aid to their country. The New York Times Supplement recently showed a picture of Miss Lauder running a cultivator. Her activities in farming were continued until June 1st when she entered upon her course in the Jefferson hospital.
