Nelson, who was in Belgium engaged in the direction of the distribution of food-stuffs, in a letter to a member of his family in Mayville, says among other things: "Beigium day here was a remarkable feature. They sold little flags in Beigium colors and little bows of tissue paper. Altogether about \$8750 was raised. The whole town took on a very gala appearance for flags were everywhere in evidence and everyone wore a Belgian bow. Some of the undergrads would buy enough to cover the front of their coats. Some wore them on their hats, at their knees, and on their shoes. Two wore them on their gowns-covered them so thickly that you couldn't tell they had gowns
