Sanborn Enterprise: A distressing accident happened Thurday morning in the east end of the Sanborn N. P. railroad yards which cost Martin Nettwood, aged about 30 years, of Kimball Praire, Minn., one of his legs below the knee. An extra freight, running at a high rate of speed, arrived at Sanborn at 7:15 making fast time to clear the west end grade. The young man wanted to get off at Sanborn and jumped from the side door of a box car. When he struck the ground he missed his footing and rolled partially under the wheels.
