We were just in this camp one day when we got spass for a six days' leave. We had a special train and the whole Batta Battal-Reserve just in had there we and then don went to London; stamped pas ould go where we liked. I stayed London for most all of my leave nd visited all of the most interest n London and places, Amo Among them was was the ing tower of London, Westminster Abber, Parliament Buildnigs, St. Paul's Cathedral and many other places.
