

A. M. BALDWIN

Word was received here Wednesday, Feb. 13, that Attorney A. M. Baldwin had died that morning at the Nelson Sanitarium in Fargo.

Mr. Baldwin had been suffering with inflammatory rheumatism for the past six months. About three weeks ago he went to Minneapolis and had his tonsils removed, and was on his way to New Mexico to spend the remainder of the winter in a milder climate, but on the train he took a turn for the worse and at Fargo had to be taken to the sanitarium. He had contracted pneumonia, and in his weakened condition he soon succumbed to the disease.

Mr. Baldwin was 58 years old and had resided in Cooperstown for about 20 years, being engaged in the practice of law. He had been a member of the state legislature for one term, and at the time of his death was Mayor of Cooperstown. He had a farm near Hannaford and was a frequent visitor in our town often taking an active part in meetings of a public character.

The funeral services were held Friday, and an unusually large gathering assembled to pay their last tribute to the departed. The remains were taken to the old home in Illinois for interment.

The Cooperstown Sentinel-Courier says: "In the passing of Mr. Baldwin, Cooperstown and Griggs county loses a man who always had the upbuilding of the city and county at heart, and a man whose friends throughout the county are legion. His activities extended over a large area, and he was a leader in all affairs of a public nature tending to the betterment of the community in which he lived. We know of no single person whose passing will be so keenly regretted, and our little city mourns his death with a sorrow deep and sincere."
