George W. Kimbell George W. Kimbell was born on February 28th, 1892, in Cass County, and died at Camp Dodge, Iowa, soon after returning there from a furlough spent at home, the cause of his death being pheumonia. The remains arrived here Saturday, October 12th, and funeral services were held outside H. H. Hagen's house at 11:00 a. m. Sunday. The services consisted of songs by the choir, prayer and a short sermon by Rev. J. C. Wilson, after which an opportunity was given all who wished to view the remains. The body was taken to the beautiful cemetery at Buffalo, N. D., for interment, and laid to rest in the place near where he had spent several years of his youth. George Kimbell was an exceptionally strong and active young man, and was noted among his soldier companions for his skill and prowess, but nevertheless he was cut down in the prime of life. Although he lost his life by disease, he sacrificed his life for his country just as truly as though he had died on the field of battle.
