

Hannaford Visited by Airship

Hannaford had its first visit from an airship Wednesday evening, Oct. 22nd, when Lieut. J. Earl Fladeland, and Mr. Edberg, his mechanic, of Portland, N. D., landed here in their Curtis biplane.
