

Tuesday's Election Results

Last Tuesday's general election resulted in a complete victory for the non-partisans in the state, with the exception of superintendent of public instruction, for which office Miss Minnie Nielson, of Valley City, easily defeated the non-partisan candidate, N. C. Macdonald.
