

Live Organization Formed For Betterment of Community

At the conclusion of the program last Tuesday evening steps were taken to start a community club here. Fifty-five members signed up that evening and nine directors, who will have charge of perfecting the organization, were elected as follows: H. J. Rohlwing, Eric O. Wallin, Frank Paulson, Alfred Nelson, Walter Hemmingson, R. D. Benson, O. A. Otteson, Al Rooth and Ernest Hoggarth.

After the meeting the directors met and elected Dr. Benson president and Mr. Otteson secretary. These men are now working out plans for the organization, and with such men as the leaders there is promise of great results for co-operation in bringing about improvements of various kinds for the community.

An educational program is being arranged for to be given in the near future, with three reels of moving pictures showing the process of the sugar beet industry, and some good speaker who will discuss sugar beet, sweet clover and sunflower raising. Other programs of like nature as well as entertainments will be arranged for later in the spring and summer.

The object of the organization is best set forth in the following words: "The purpose of this club is to organize Community friendship with a view to the creation of good will among all classes of citizens. To create intelligent public opinion on Community problems. To stimulate Community thought to conscious and efficient direction of its own affairs."

When the organization work is completed the various branches of work to be taken up will be looked after by Committees that will be appointed or elected.

One of the things that will likely be taken up by the Club at an early date is the erection of a Community Hall providing for a large auditorium, gymnasium rest rooms and so on. Improvement of the local educational facilities will be considered, as well as improved farming conditions, marketing conditions, and social conditions.
