

Creamery Will Not Be Rebuilt

At a meeting of the stockholders of the Griggs County Creamery Association Saturday it was decided not to rebuild the Hannaford creamery recently destroyed by fire. While the creamery was run here it was a great factor in promoting the dairy industry of the community, but while doing well as a business enterprise the last few years, it can hardly be claimed that it has been a direct success financially. Furthermore, the cost of rebuilding at the present time and the uncertainty of future conditions in the state, makes it unwise to rebuild now.

To somewhat offset the loss to the community by the absence of a creamery, the Midway City Creamery has rented the building formerly occupied by the W. H. Richardson Meat Market and has opened a cream station there under the management of L. J. Gaspar, formerly manager of the Hannaford Creamery. Mr. Gaspar will also buy butter and eggs and all kinds of produce and also sell creamery butter and ice cream.
