

The equipment for the playground at the school house has arrived and was put up during vacation. It consists of a giant stride, horizontal bar, slide and swings. A slide has also been donated by Mr. Angus and will be put up in the near future. This equipment is more for the younger children and in order that there might also be some play and recreation for the older children, an athletic association has been organized, the members of which are the pupils of the High School and Grammar Room, and also the teachers. In order to buy a little equipment a membership fee of 25c is charged. Since the attendance is small this does not bring in a large sum, but perhaps sufficient to buy nets for a tennis court and also for a volley ball court, a volley ball, and a few tennis balls. The boys are willing and eager to fix up the two courts so there will not be much other expense. Beside the play ground equipment the school board has also purchased a basket ball and a foot ball. The officers of the Athletic Association are: Ralph Knauss, president; Mildred Dunnum, secretary; Miss Walker, manager. It is hoped that this small beginning will work up into a strong, permanent organization and any help or co-operation from the people in town will be greatly appreciated. The base ball organization will still continue as a separate organization. The boys are few in number but in spite of that hope to work up a strong team.
