offered prayer, two selections were rendered by the choir, and Rev. T. Hanson, of Page, delivered a very eloquent and powerful sermon. Interment was made in Eidfjord cemetery, where Rev. P. A. Thoreson spoke briefly and the earthly remains were laid to their final resting place under the solemn rites of the Lutheran church.

Words are vain to assuage the grief of the stricken relatives of this model young man who died at the very zenith of his powers. He heard his country's call, obeyed the voice of duty and his conscience without quibble or questioning, and, with his death, gave to his country "the last full measure of devotion."
