Alex Karr called several men of the community together at the Hannaford Hotel Thursday forenoon and presented his community co-operation plan. This is a movement in which farmers and business men over the state are becoming interestì ed and promises to be very successful. By means of entertainments and lectures an effort will be made 3 to foster a better community spirit. to build up the home community 1 social life and to keep North Dakota ! money and North Bakota boys and girls at home. Only 27 per cent of people in the United States reside in the country, The remainder are in the larger centers of population and the cities. The farms are growing larger instead of smaller, we are losing our population, and by an insidious system of propaganda and advertising, the large centers are becoming strong at the expense of the smaller communities. It is this menace that the community co-operation clubs will combat by a series of lectures and entertainments, and about 15 or 20 citizens of this section signed up to get behind the movement and push it along.
