At the close of the court session, Judge Coffey briefly addressed the jurors and others assembled in the court room, calling attention to the fact, that while the war was over so far as actual fighting was concerned, it was not over by any means so far as we are concerned.

He pointed out that momentous questions would come up at the peace conference, and urged his hearers to subscribe liberally to the United War Work fund and other funds for the benefit of the boys in Europe, whose comfort we must not lose sight of. Judge Coffey said that now that the fighting was over the soldiers would be subject to temptation in a larger measure than formerly, and that money contributed to the Y. M. C. A. and other war work organizations helps furnish the right sort of diversion and entertainment for them when off duty.

As usual the court term in Griggs county was very brief, occupying only one day.
