

Marwell Wait arrived in Hannaford Thursday from overseas for a brief visit with his sisters, Mrs. L. Moore and Mrs. Grover Saunders and his brother Ralph Wait. Mr. Wait left Hannaford with a bunch of boys from this vicinity on March 12, 1918, and sailed for France almost immediately, reaching France on May 12th, 1918. He left France on his home trip May 10, 1919, there serving one year in foreign service.

Although he saw no active service, he did his bit, doing convoy duty for the first six months, and then acting as an assistant in office work the remainder of the time. Army life was not too hard on him and his friends and relatives are all glad to see him safe home again. He left Hannaford on No. 2 Thursday evening for St. Paul, Minn., where he will make his home with his mother, Mrs. Anna Wait.
