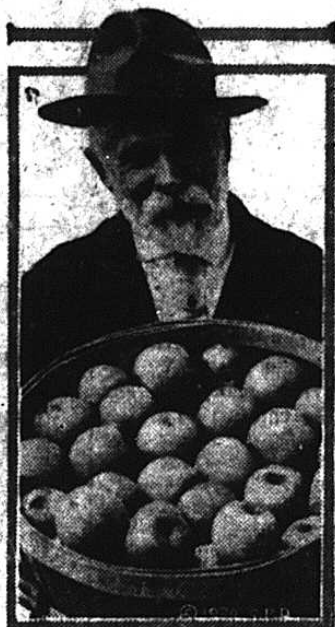
The motor Inn just received a car-
