Sugar Shortage

Langdon Republican: Almost every housewife in Langdon is now compelled to get along without sugar and with the canning season on, the situation is decidedly unpleasant. There seemed to be plenty of sugar to be had during the month of July and while reports stated that the available supply was short no one expected such a complete tie up as is now being experienced. The government officials have made a great deal of noise but to date little definite action has been taken that will bring sugar right away. If enormous quantities are stored and held for a big price not enough has been discovered to maintain that condition. The local dealers are generally of the opinion that the canners have purchased large quantities on contracts for their business and this has absorbed the supply. Those not contracting are unable to purchase and secure shipments. Some of the dealers are of the opinion that the canners are largely responsible for this and planned their purchases knowing that they could
