Corn, 119 Bushel One North Dakot: els on One Acre ota acre in Sargo inty produced 119 2-3 bushels of nature corn this year. Wesley Coo-er, a member of the North Dakota Wesley Coo per, a meaning.

Boys' and Girls' Clubs, won a state
championship on his acre of corn. This won for him a trip to the Boys' and Girls' Institute, a week's course in Agriculture and Home Econ given at the North Dakota Agricultural College for club winners. an the count of his big family, one planted home grown seed May 19th.
