TIMBER CULTURE. * MAJ. STRAIT'S AMENDING BILL.

Washington, Special Telegram, Jan. 10.—
The following is the text of Mr. Strait's bill.
Section 1. That the first section of said act be, and the same is, amenied, to read as follows: That the act entitled "An act to amend the act entitled an act to encourage the growth of timber on the Western prairies," approved March 13, 1874, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows, That any person who is the head of a family, or who has arrived at the age of twenty-one years, and is a citizen of the United States, or who shall have filed his declaration of intention to become such as is required by the naturalization laws of the United States, who shall plant, protect and keep in a healthy, growing condition for eighty acres, or fractional subdivision of eighty acres, or fractional subdivision of eighty acres, or fractional subdivision of each each such as a subdivision of leighty acres, or leading the first provided in Sec. 2 shall receive a patent for such fact; provided, further, that no more than one-quarter of any section shall be granted, and that no person shall make more than one entry under the provisions of this act.




