The Tower City Herald in turning its fifth mile post enlarges and improves.

Fargo is to have a fine new bank building, corner of N. P. Avenue and Broadway.

The proposed bill to legalize the location of the capital at Bismarck has not been introduced in congress yet, and it is thought the time is not auspicious for the passage of such a measure.

In Brown county it is said that the receipts from saloon licenses are more than ten thousand dollars a year, which more than pays the wages of all the school teachers in the county.
