There is occasionally a day when no new name is presented for governorship of Dakota. An oversight, probably.

La Moure Progress: A party of land seekers from New Mexico have picked out land a few miles out of La Moure, and will go to farming at once. Thus they are coming from every clime to the bright, pure Dakota atmosphere.

Among the names before the committee of the United States senate, from which they selected Lincoln for North Dakota, were Pembina, Mandan, Garfield, Jefferson, Ogalalla, Franklin and and Hidosta. The preference for Lincoln was unanimous.
