The Oregon Improvement company alias Henry Villard, was promised by Henry 30,000 acres of coal land owned by Henry, alias the N. P. R. Co. Before the land was conveyed Henry and the company became disamalgamated, as it were, and the Improvement company (or Henry) are out the coal lands. Thus broke a very comfortable nest egg.

The Grand Trunk has closed a contract to carry 75,000 bushels of wheat from Chicago to Liverpool at the rate of fifteen cents per hundred. The rail haul from Chicago to Montreal is over six times the distance from the Red River valley to Duluth, for which wheat is taxed 25 cents per hundred. It cannot be charged that this is because of the proportion of shipment, for North Dakota sends many times 75,000 bushels of No. 1 hard to Duluth.—Argus.

A mixture of Chicago toughs, imported by the Marquis de Mores, with the native cowboys of Medora, evidently makes a bad lot. The Dickinson Press says "Medora is clamoring for a county organization in Billings county. We hope they will get it.
