

**Land-Scrip Carpenter Convicted.**  
Yankton, Special.—After a trial of nearly one month, the jury in the fraudulent scrip case rendered a verdict against E. E. Carpenter, of guilty of conspiracy to defraud the United States in issuing fraudulent scrip. Defendant's counsel gave notice of a motion for a stay of judgment and a new trial. The defendant could not get all the witnesses he desired, and did not make a very vigorous defense, intending to make this motion. He will also argue that as the New Orleans subtreasury was not established by congress, no conspiracy against the United States could be committed by making bogus scrip. It is thought that the motion for a new trial may be granted. If not the sentence must be pronounced, and W. D. Russell, convicted two years ago and now on bail, must also receive a sentence. Cameron's trial will be postponed. About a month ago it will be remembered, Carpenter escaped from custody and went to Iowa, where he was rearrested and taken back to Yankton, and the usual formalities of law. D. J. Spaulding of LaCrosse, charged with complicity in the scrip frauds, was tried and acquitted on the 11th inst.

**Great Storm in Ohio and Pennsylvania.**  
A terrific thunder storm passed over a portion of Western Pennsylvania and Eastern Ohio last Thursday, damaging property and killing several persons and a large amount of live stock. At Murrayville, Pa., a boy named Wolf and four horses were struck by lightning and killed. A young brother of the boy was badly burned. At Waynesburg, Pa., Miss Josie Keenes and William Rader were seriously injured by a lightning bolt and three horses killed. At Corry, Pa., several head of blooded stock belonging to Henry Case were killed. At Salem, Ohio, Miss Minnie Westport, aged six, was standing in the doorway when lightning struck the veranda, killing her instantly. At Youngstown Ohio, lightning struck the house of Abner Meadekner, killing his daughter and severely injuring others of the family. Three barns were destroyed. At Newcomers-town, Ohio, the storm was accompanied by a furious tornado, trees were uprooted, fences blown down, and great damage done to crops.

**Boiler Disaster at Wausau, Wis.**  
The boiler of Smith's planing mill in Wausau, Wis., exploded Wednesday morning with terrible force. It was bedded in brick, which fell in a shower for blocks around. It shook the whole city. Four persons were killed outright, and many badly hurt. The killed are: Mary Crocker, George Brown, foreman and engineer, August Stricke, foreman, blown to pieces. William Buchanan, shipper for M. B. Atwater & Co., badly hurt, and will die. Many others are more or less injured. Adjacent houses were badly shattered. A piece of boiler weighing nearly a ton was blown over a woodshed and against the side of a building ten yards distant, shattering brick and shattering every window in the house. Eight persons were in the room where the piece struck, but escaped with but slight injuries.

The discussion of the Mexican pension bill in the senate brought out some queer statistics about the pensioners of the war of 1812. That war was ended nearly seventy years ago, and the number of troops engaged in it was not remarkable, yet to-day there are actually 21,000 pensioners on the roll, as widows of that war. They draw last year \$1,881,000, or five and a half times as much as the few old soldiers surviving. Of course, the explanation is that some of the widows were married to the veteran warriors half a century or so after the war was over and they became entitled to their pensions in due time, when their husbands died. Thus it is not impossible that in the twentieth century a greater part of the 21,000 widows will still be drawing pensions on account of the war of 1812.

Fred H. Smith, leader of the quartet of Dr. Talmage's church, Brooklyn, has disappeared. A shortage of from \$8,000 to \$40,000 is rumored, and also the disappearance of an attractive female.

**Mormons Still Coming.**

Twenty-five Mormon missionaries, with 501 converts—401 Scandinavians and 100 English—arrived at New York by the steamship Arizona en route to Salt Lake City, under charge of Chief Elder C. H. Nye. As the steamer reached the dock, a roll call was held, and each elder was detailed to his respective post. The young women looked listless as the elders rushed in among them, giving orders. Elder Nye said: "The converts I bring are not all recent accessions, some having been members of the church over thirty years, who through lack of means or other causes have been unable to come here. I am now going back to Utah to remain there, and within a short time of our arrival a further relay of elders will be sent to Europe to keep up the work. I consider that I have been very successful. Referring to the arrest of Mormon missionaries in Vienna, Mr. Nye says: "I do not contemplate any serious outcome from it."

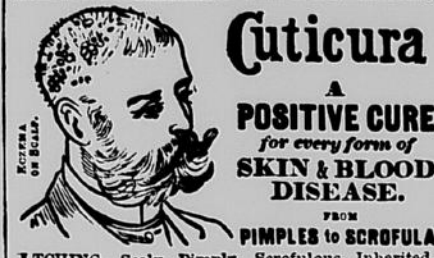
