Freight receipts at Cooperstown station during the month of July were \$5,575.75. Receipts from tickets sold, \$333.82.

The pay car came up Sunday with Superintendent Graham in charge. Mr. Graham is as regular and methodical as clock work in the administration of the company's affairs.

Holland & Rukke will be unable to fill their orders for steam threshers. There are not enough made to supply the demand. The harvest will surpass our wildest expectations.
