Current Gossip.

A writer estimates the requirements of Europe, this year, at 218,000,000 bushels of wheat, of which Russia is expected to supply 56,000,000 and India 44,000,000, leaving 92,000,000 to be shipped from America.

J. G. Madland has purchased the buildings of G. W. Cowdrey, that the latter built in the park at Fargo as a greenhouse, Mr. Cowdrey having decided to return to Valley City.

The name of Hon. G. M. Wing will be presented to the legislative convention at Bismarck, October 15, and we shall then see if Valley City will stand by her word. If they do not, the polls will be open in November.—Oriska Benefit.

Hanlan has won sixteen championship races and \$35,000 since 1877, rowing in Canada, this country, England and Australia, and defeated Ross three times, Courtney, Trickett and Laycock twice each, and Plaisted, Morris, Hawdon, Elliott, Riley, Boyd and Kennedy once each.

It is reported that the preliminary survey of the proposed Carrington, Sanborn & Lake Traverse railroad, between Carrington and Sanborn, will be commenced soon. The survey east of Sanborn was completed last fall. It is the intention of this corporation to make the necessary preparations for the commencement of the construction of the road as early as practicable in the spring.—Alert.
