

Proceedings of County Commissioners.

Met September 1, 1884, at 2 p. m., having been adjourned from day to day by the clerk since August 27, 1884.

Present, Messrs. Rukke, Cooper and Halverson, Commissioner Cooper presiding.

On motion ordered that Wm. Kingsley, L. L. Hubbard and David Nicoll be appointed viewers of the following proposed public road, viz:

Commenting at the s w corner of tp. 146, r. 61 and running thence in an easterly direction on the most eligible route to s w corner of sec. 36, township 146, r. 60; thence north along west line of said section to the n w corner said section 36; thence east on north line of section 36 to quarter stake between sections 36 and 25, tp. 146, r. 60. Signed by Wm. Kingsley, Christ E. Kjelson, Swan C. Swanson and others.

On motion ordered that F. D. Fenner, J. H. Van Voorhees and C. Fromm be appointed viewers of the following proposed public road, viz:

Commencing at the quarter stake between secs. 36 and 25 tp. 146, r. 60, and running thence in a northeasterly direction to a point between secs. 19 and 30, tp. 146, r. 59, on the ridge and about 40 rods west of the n e corner of said sec. 30; thence easterly, following the south section lines of sections 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23, or as near there as practicable to the town of Cooperstown. Signed by F. D. Fenner, W. Wilson, Alexander Nicoll and others.

On motion ordered that H. Williams G. Lockwood and Maynard Crane be appointed viewers of the following proposed public road, viz:

Commencing at the southwest corner of sec. 30, tp. 146, r. 61, and running thence in an easterly direction on the most eligible route to quarter stake between secs. 25 and 36, tp. 146, r. 60. Signed by E. E. Fitch, G. Lockwood, John Williams and others.

On motion ordered that Ole Balkan, C. P. Balkan and S. O. Homme be appointed viewers of the following proposed public road, viz:

Commencing at the section corner between secs. 20, 21, 29 and 28, tp. 146, r. 58, and running thence easterly on the most eligible route to section corner between secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, tp. 146, r. 58. Signed by A. A. Fluto, Ole J. Skrien, Peder P. Knudson and others.

On motion ordered that a refunding order be issued to Helge Larson for \$10.65, school township tax, having been assessed in the wrong township.

On motion ordered that the following proposals of Alexander Moffat be accepted, viz:

For graining, wainscotting and floors of court house—Plain, 15 cents per yard; fancy, 20 cents per yard.

For building privy according to plans submitted, \$208.

For plastering three jail cells one heavy coat, \$81.

On motion ordered that F. B. Edwards be instructed to procure four registers and place in court house for ventilating.

On motion ordered that the following tax levy be made on the valuation of all property subject to taxation within Griggs county, D. T., for the year 1884, viz:

Two mills on the dollar of valuation for roads.

Two mills on the dollar of valuation for bridges.

Four mills on the dollar of valuation for general county revenue.

Three and one-half mills on the dollar of valuation for interest on court house bonds.

One dollar and fifty cents, or one day's labor, for each male person between the ages of 21 and 50 years.
