

More Bacon.

Hon. Ignatius Donnelly, the democratic candidate for congress in the Third Minneapolis district, author of Atlantis and Ragnarok, claims to have made a discovery in regard to Shakespeare's plays, which, if true, will produce a great sensation. The Plowing Match.

On last Friday afternoon the plowing match between the Hapgood Sulky plow and a common walking plow took place, as advertised. The following is the report of the committee appointed to test the draft of the two plows: COOPERSTOWN, Sept. 5, 1884.—We, the undersigned, having been chosen a committee by the farmers present, to test the draft and work of the Hapgood Sulky Plow, as compared with a Grand De-tour walking plow, report as follows: The Hapgood Sulky is very easy to throw out of the ground in turning; lays out and finishes a land perfectly; can be adjusted to any depth, or leveled while the team is in motion; does first class work, and is lighter on the team than the walking plow, the following being the result of a careful test with a Fairbank's Dynamometer:

- HAPGOOD SULKY PLOW.
 - Width of cut, 16 inches.
 - Depth of furrow, 6 inches.
 - Average draft, 340 pounds.
 - GRAND DETOUR WALKING PLOW.
 - Width of cut, 15 inches.
 - Depth of furrow, 5.8 inches.
 - Average draft, 362.5 pounds.
