The man turned pale, but quickly gaining his composure, instantly transacted his business and departed. The next morning his body was found hanging to a beam in his room. The neighbor's wife called soon afterward and told the story. She was in Germany at the time of the murder of the shepherd, and had seen the young murderer very often, but never knew his name. Soon after she left for Germany for the states. She never forgot the face of the murderer, and instantly recognized it on the morning of their meeting.

Operations in Pills.
