

NEWS OF THE WEEK.

Washington News.

Postoffices established:—Dixon, Hamilton county, Dak.; Amans, Iowa county, Iowa; Augusta, Lewis and Clarke county, Mont. Postmasters Commissioned—Robert H. Wear, Glaston, Mont. New Offices—Samuel E. Bostwick, Hawarth, Grandy county, Col.; Joseph N. Root, Root Emmons county, Dak.; Peter Peterson, Lindsay, Polk county, Minn.

The present force of special agents employed by the general land office to investigate fraudulent entries of the public lands and protect actual settlers is represented to be too small to discharge that duty, and it is probable that Commissioner McFarland will, in his annual report, recommend congress to make provision for one special agent at each of the 108 land districts.

Rail and River News.

The Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha railroad shows gross earnings for the first six months of 1884, \$979,131.85, an increase of \$115,825.97 over the same period of 1883. The tax is \$28,421.

Casualties of the Week.

David Cover, one of the prominent citizens, of Stillwater, Minn., was drowned Sunday.

Bursting boilers at Peoria, Ill., and Eufula, Ala., killed half a score of men and destroyed considerable property.

Near White Cloud, Mich., fire destroyed McLane's saw-mill, twenty houses occupied by employes and over a million feet of lumber. Loss \$25,000.

At East Saginaw, Mich., six dwellings, a store, boarding house, office and 2,000 cords of slabs at Hamilton, McClure & Co.'s mill was burned. Loss, \$10,000; insurance, \$8,000.

Crimes and Criminals.

J. C. Baker's residence in Butte, Mont., was entered by burglars, and jewelry worth \$700 taken.

A crank, said to be from the South, and armed with a revolver, was arrested in Cleveland, after seeking and being denied admission to Mrs. Garfield's house.

Dr. Felix O'Hare of New York, charged with manslaughter in being accessory to the death of Michael Lacey by giving him poison in mistake for medicine, was arrested and held in default of \$5,000 bail.

The body of Gen. Helm, brigadier of the First Kentucky brigade, and who fell in the battle before Atlanta, will be disinterred there with military honors Wednesday, for removal to Kentucky, to be buried near Elizabeth. He was a brother-in-law of Lincoln.

At Yankton, the jury in the case of Edward McKenna, on trial for the murder of Nicholas Berringer last December at Tyndall, returned a verdict of not guilty. Berringer was killed in a drunken row in which McKenna was involved, the prosecution claiming that McKenna stabbed Berringer with a knife.

Personal News Notes.

Mrs. Gen. George W. Cullom died at Newport R. I. She was the widow of Gen. Halleck.

Robert Hoe, of the Hoe printing press manufacturing firm, died at his residence at Tarrytown New York, aged seventy.

General News Items.

Ohio will send 100 varieties of wheat to the New Orleans exposition.

New Brunswick's bursted bank has debts aggregating \$630,000, and assets of \$570,000.

Conkling says the campaign thus far has been "a saturnalia of imbecility and maure."

There have been 173 applicants for admission at Princeton college this year; of these probably 160 will be admitted.

Ottawa is excited over the elopement of a seventeen-year-old son of Postmaster General Carling with a maiden of sweet sixteen.

A grand altar, made in Munich, at a cost of about \$3,000, will be placed in the Catholic church at Carrolltown, Cambria county, Pa., in a few days.

William H. Vanderbilt's account with Maud S. shows a profit of \$19,000, nearly 95 per cent. leaving out the expense of keeping the pretty beast and her driver.

Cleveland society is excited over the elopement of D. D. Rocks, a wealthy builder, having a wife and four children, with Mrs. Quine, wife of a builder, who left a husband and two children. They are supposed to be in Chicago.

When Sitting Bull was asked, at New York, what most impressed him since reaching the white man's country, he replied that the whites went on to the streets and made money when they were little children, and ought to be at play.

Maj. Abram J. Gifford, Indian agent at Fort Berthold, is on his way to his home in Hudson, N. Y. The major reports the Indians in his charge all in good condition, "fat because happy and happy because fat." Their crops of wheat and corn are good—in fact the best ever raised at the agency—in amount about 10,000 bushels of wheat and the same quantity of corn. Fort Stevenson, seventeen miles above Fort Berthold, is also under Maj. Gifford's supervision, and there the government has established an Indian school, which at present has an attendance of fifty Indian children. Arrangements are being made to increase the capacity, and soon 150 of these red children will be under instruction there.

Foreign Flashes.

Henry M. Stanley will certainly not return to the Congo river country this year.

Liberal meetings in England are attended by vast crowds, in some cases by 50,000 people.

France has not yet declared war against China, yet Minister Ferry has ordered Admiral Courbet to take another turn at bombarding the Celestials.

The British Army and Navy Gazette declares that in the opinion of every man who knows, the Nile boats ordered by the government for the Nile expedition are useless. It says: "A more wicked waste of money has never been committed. The monstrous armada is only fit for firewood." The government is sending 16,000 pounds of dynamite to Egypt with a view to exploding a passage way for boats through the Nile cataracts.

Murder in Iowa.

Between 7 and 8 o'clock Monday morning Henry Winter, who lives nine miles south of Le Mars, Iowa, was shot and instantly killed by Hugh Moist, a neighbor. The shooting was the result of an old feud, and was unprovoked.

The murderer came into town Monday forenoon and gave himself up. Bail was refused, and the accused was committed to jail to await the action of the grand jury. It is believed that the murderer is of unsound mind. He has a brother in the asylum at present. Winter leaves a wife and child in destitute circumstances. At the inquest Monday afternoon a verdict of wilful murder was returned.

Flood Losses in the Chippewa Valley.

A summary of the losses throughout the valley, rendered possible by the very complete and thorough examination made by the corps of reporters who have been busy for several days past, does not materially alter the original estimate of the damage done by the flood in the entire valley. Monuments of the British Scientists.

Winnipeg, Man., Special. The members of the British association who passed through here last Wednesday on a trip to the Rockies returned here Monday night. In the mountains Prof. Selwin and Mr. Lawson, of the dominion geological survey, and Dr. Royal of Manchester, England, had a miraculous escape from a fearful death. While crossing a bridge in the Kicking Horse pass an immense body of rock came crashing down the mountain side, and falling on the bridge bore it down into the yawning gorge. By clinging to the timbers which did not fall, the trio succeeded in escaping, beyond trifling bruises. In Winnipeg a reception was tendered the party in the Princess Opera house. Sir Richard Temple on behalf of the association made a speech reviewing the trip, paying a compliment to the country by stating that in his opinion, judging from what he had seen, there was sufficient fertile land in the Northwest territories to supply the whole world with food. The party disbanded here, half going into the States to visit the Yellow Stone Park, New York, Boston, Washington and other points of interest. The other half return to Eastern Canada by the lake route and when reaching Montreal will branch off in various directions.

Circus Tent and Menagerie Blown Down.

The tents of Barrett's circus and menagerie were blown down during the Monday performance at Winona, Minn. The wind lifted the main canvas, dragging the side poles, which struck a number of people. A good deal of excitement existed, but no panic. Mrs. Durley of Minnesota City was rendered unconscious by a blow on the head, carried to an adjoining house, and afterward recovered so that she was able to walk to a carriage. Sheriff Bogart's son, fourteen years old, was knocked insensible by a blow on the head from a pole. He was taken home and revived in a short time. Brickie De Greff received a bloody scalp wound, but was able to walk. Many sustained pretty severe bruises, but no bones appear to have been broken. The main canvas was ripped in two. The fair had its amusing features. The fat lady got soaked through, and the washing was a dead give away on a tattooed Zulu whose colors ran together like a cheap piece of calico.

Shot Down by a Tramp.

Mrs. Jamison, living near Lehigh, Webster county, Iowa, was shot and killed at 11 o'clock Tuesday by a tramp. Mr. Jamison is treasurer of the school district in which he lives, and was supposed to have a considerable sum of the district's funds at his home. The tramp entered the house, demanded the money, and was told by Mrs. Jamison that it was deposited in the bank at Webster City. The tramp became enraged and used some vile language, whereupon Mrs. Jamison proceeded to take her pistol from her bureau drawer, but the tramp was too quick for her, using his own weapon, shooting her through the heart. The daughter was the only person at the house with Mrs. Jamison. She spread the news, and the tramp's retreat, and a posse of citizens, well armed, from Lehigh, were soon on his track. The sheriff at Fort Dodge was quickly sent for, and it is thought the man will be caught, in which event the people threaten to lynch him.
