## The County Convention.

The convention was called to order at 3 p. m. Saturday, October 18, at the school house. The county committee examined the credentials of the different delegations, and decided that Cooperstown, Helena, Willow, Pleasantview, Wheatland and Mardell precincts were entitled to participate in the preliminary organization, the Ottowa precinct sending two delegations.

H. Retzlaff was then elected temporary chairman, but declined, and Joseph Buchheit was substituted. Beecher Cox was made temporary secretary.

A committee on credentials, consisting of Messrs. Knudson, Retzlaff and Howden, was appointed, who reported in favor of the admission of the Rollef Berg delegation from Ottowa, which upon vote was admitted.

J. Buchheit was made permanent chairman and R. C. Brophy, secretary. The following nominations were then made:

This settles the republican county ticket for the November election. The convention was fairly called, and we believe represents the sentiments of the people. While there was concerted action, and perhaps a slate written up, as a guide to the proceedings of the meeting, nothing that transpired savored of trickery, fraud, disregard of the rights of legitimate delegations, or bull-dozing. The nominees are entitled to the support of the republican party in Griggs county, and we expect to see the entire ticket elected.

The ticket is a conservative one, most of the old officers being retained. Naturally, some will feel dissatisfied with the outcome; but they cannot but admit that they have had a "fighting" chance in a more than ordinarily fairly appointed delegate convention, and that in event of any independent movement the chances are and should be against them.

There is a great consumption of crow in the republican party this year, all around, and, to the dissatisfaction, the result of this convention should be considered simply as an invitation to the banquet, where will be met many dis-

tinguished citizens. Personally, the COURIER is well satisfied with the ticket. The nominees are unobjectionable, and the manner of their nomination fair.

The election in Cincinnati passed off quietly. The following is the list of those killed and injured: Albert Russell, colored.
