TERRITORIAL OFFICERS. Governor—N. G. Ordway. Delegate in Congress—John B. Raymond, of Fargo.

An exchange says, with regard to Dr. G. F. Newell, the democratic nominee for the legislature, from Griggs: "Perhaps, more than any other candidate herein mentioned, he represents the pure principles of government that were in vogue in the times of Jefferson and Jackson."

There were never truer words uttered than these, and the only trouble with the doctor's candidacy was the color of his ticket. Dakota is republican. Dr. Newell so recognized it; and that his nomination was simply honorary.

Dr. Newell is chairman of the democratic central committee, a democrat of the democrats, one of the fathers of his party, and perhaps no man in the Northwest feels more elated over the democratic victories in the nation, without regard to the territorial legislature, than he.
