ALLEGED KNAVERY.

Valley City, Nov. 8.—A bold election outrage came to light here to-day, when Commissioner James Daily discovered that two poll boxes, containing election returns and uncast votes, had been stolen from the commissioners' room last night. The perpetrators gained entrance through a window. As a contest has been threatened it is thought some one of the defeated candidates are mixed up in the matter. The community is greatly excited over the affair, and the person or persons engaged in the outrage will be handled roughly if detected. Another election will probably be necessary.

Fargo, Nov. 10, 4 p. m.—New York is still claimed by both parties. Nothing definite can be ascertained until the official returns come in from the county clerks. The democrats will consider every effort to do Blaine justice in a fair count, as a counting out of Cleveland. The opinion is gaining ground that Blaine has a small plurality in the state, although nothing positive can be known.
