JULY 3.

10 a. m. Bicycle race for boys under 14 years,  
residents of Griggs Co., 1/4 mile. Purse \$5  
and \$1.  
10:15 a. m. Base Ball. Purse \$125.  
1:30 p. m. Plantation melodies by colored  
quartet on street.  
2:00 p. m. 2:25 class, trot or pace, purse \$250.  
Farmers' trot or pace, purse \$100.  
(Farmers' race to be confined to horses  
owned by actual farmers residing on their  
farms in Griggs or Steele county. The

July 23 was held at Fargo

Convention was called to order by the  
county chairman, David Bartlett.  
On motion duly seconded and carried,  
William Glass was elected chairman  
and M. C. Spicer, secretary.

tee of three on credentials be appoint-  
ed. Chair appointed Messrs. Purinton,  
Tande and Warner.

Moved and carried that a commit-  
tee of three on resolutions be appoint-  
ed. Chair appointed Messrs. Carleton,  
Homme and Bartlett.

Report of committee on credentials  
adopted.

The report of committee on resolu-  
tions was adopted. The report is  
as follows:

Resolved, That we heartily approve  
and endorse the economical and con-  
servative administration of Gov.  
Frank White and we believe that good  
business and good politics demand his  
renomination and election.

Resolved, That the delegates to the  
state convention vote as a unit and  
those present cast the full vote of the  
delegation.

Moved that Hon. David Bartlett be  
allowed to name the delegation and  
that this delegation be instructed to  
use all honorable means to secure his  
renomination for lieutenant-governor.

Mr. Bartlett fought this motion but  
was turned down by the convention  
and the above motion carried.

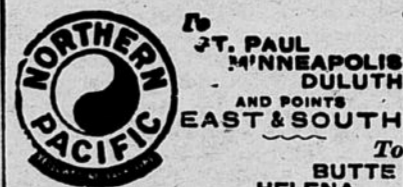
