Board of county commissioners of Griggs county, state of North Dakota met in regular session pursuant to law this 7th day of July A. D. 1902. Present J. Buchheit, H. Wilson, Chas. Nelson, J. T. Fosholdt and G. J. Thorvald Gundersen appeared before the board and offered to pay the amount of sales and taxes due on part of set of Sec. 4, Twp. 147, Rg. 58 for an assignment of said sale. On motion made seconded and carried the same was accepted.

Moved and seconded that the town of Addie be allowed \$125.00 to be expended on road on township line of section 4 between Addie and Willows townships. Motion carried.

On motion the board adjourned to meet July 8, 1902, 9 o'clock a. m.

Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment this 8th day of July A. D. 1902. All members present.

On motion the following bill was allowed:

The board then proceeded to review and equalize assessments in which occupation the forenoon session was used.

On motion board adjourned to meet 2 o'clock p. m.

Board met according to adjournment.

Moved and seconded that the town of Washburn and Romness be allowed \$100 each to be used in road work on township line between sections 6 and 31, motion carried.

Moved and seconded that John K Baxter be appointed road overseer for the 2d district. Motion carried.

The board then proceeded with the review and equalization of assessment the balance of the afternoon session.

On motion board adjourned to meet July 9th, 1902, at 9 o'clock a. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment this 9th day of July A. D. 1902. All members present.

The board proceeded with the review and equalization of assessment the whole forenoon session.

On motion board adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment and continued with the review and equalization of assessments the whole afternoon session.

On motion board adjourned to meet July 10th A. D. 1902 at 9 o'clock a. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment this 10th day of July A. D. 1902. All members present.

The board then proceeded with the review and equalization of assessments the balance of the forenoon session and completed the same.

On motion board adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment and proceeded to check up the county treasurer and auditor which said officials were found to be correct.

Moved and seconded that all moneys collected as interest and penalty be credited to the road and bridge fund. Motion carried.

Moved that the following preamble and resolution be adopted.

That, Whereas the probable expenses for the coming financial year will be as follows to-wit:

And, whereas certain fees are paid into the county treasury for the benefit of the general fund thereby reducing the taxes to be levied to that extent.

Therefore be it resolved by the board of county commissioners of the county of Griggs and state of North Dakota, that the following taxes be levied upon all real and personal property assessed for the year 1902 in the county of Griggs and state of North Dakota as follows, to-wit:

For general purposes the sum of eleven thousand dollars..... 11000 00

For the payment of interest on a bonded indebtedness of \$30,000, the sum of two thousand dollars..... 2000 00

For the sinking fund for the payment of maturing bonds the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars..... 1500 00

For the maintenance of roads and bridges the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars..... 1500 00

For emergency purposes the sum of two thousand dollars..... 2000 00

Making a total for all purposes the sum of eighteen thousand dollars..... 18000 00

The motion was seconded and carried all voting in the affirmative.

Moved and seconded that T O Hetager be engaged for another year at a salary of \$30 per month. Motion carried:

Commissioner's Proceedings

Relating to the Review and Equalization of Assessments.

The Board of County Commissioners of Griggs County, State of North Dakota, being in regular session, proceeded to review and equalize the assessment of real and personal property in and for the county of Griggs and state of North Dakota at their forenoon session, July 8th, A. D. 1902, and continued in session the whole forenoon.

On motion Board adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Moved and seconded that the personal property assessment of Ole Anderson made by the assessor of Pilot Mound be taken off the list for said town as all his property was assessed in the town of Willow. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the following changes be made in the assessed value of lands it being the opinion of the Board that such changes will make the assessment equal and to be the full and true value thereof to-wit: Town of Lenora raised 20 per cent; Town of Rosendal raised 10 per cent; Town of Tyrol raised 10 per cent; Town of Willow raised 5 per cent. Motion carried unanimously.

On motion Board adjourned to meet July 9th, A. D. 1902, at 9 o'clock a. m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Moved and seconded that the Messing Threshing Co., be raised in value on separators 100 per cent and on engines 100 per cent. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the following changes be made in the value of horses, it being the opinion of the Board that such changes will make the assessment more equal and to be the full and true value thereof to-wit:

Town of Addie horses 1 year old raised 3 per cent.

Town of Willow horses 1 year old raised 20 per cent, 2 years old raised 10 per cent, 3 years old raised 7 per cent.

Town of Tyrol horses 3 years old raised 5 per cent.

Town of Bald Hill horses 1 year old lowered 13 per cent, 2 years old raised 22 per cent, 3 years old raised 3 per cent.

Town of Rosendal horses 1 year old lowered 20 per cent, 3 years old raised 7 per cent.

Town of Cooperstown horses 1 year old raised 5 per cent, 2 years old raised 5 per cent, 3 years old raised 20 per cent.

Town of Clearfield horses 1 year old lowered 13 per cent.

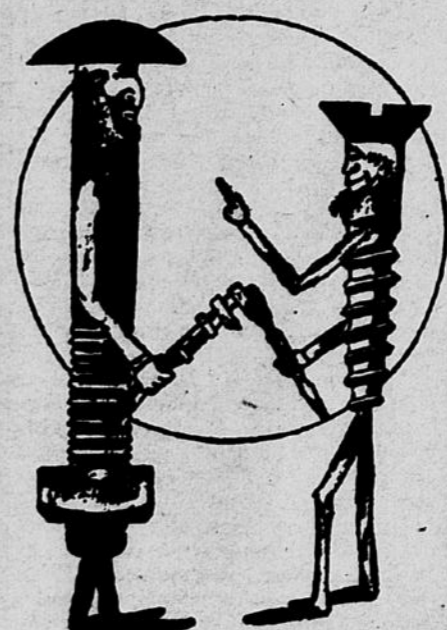
