

This is a falling off of \$8,000,000 from the estimate made by Secretary of the Treasury Gage last November in his annual report, but this has been due to a reduction in the internal revenue receipts, which was caused by the passage of the repeal of the war revenue act by Congreess about three months ago. The twelve months of 1901-02. however, make a much better showing than any since 1887-88, when the excess of revenue over expenditure was \$111,000,000. 
