CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

The following proposed amendments to the Constitution of North Dakota, having passed the Seventh Legislative Assembly, will be submitted to the Eighth Legislative Assembly for approval or rejection:

Proposed Constitutional Amendment. Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

That subdivision 8 of Section 215, of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota be amended so as to read as follows:
 Subdivision 8. A state hospital for the insane at the City of Jamestown, in the county of Stutsman. And the legislative assembly shall appropriate twenty thousand acres of the grant of lands made by the act of Congress aforesaid for "Other Educational and Charitable Institutions" to the benefit and for the endowment of said institution, and there shall be located at or near the City of Grafton, in the county of Walsh, an institution for the feeble minded, on the grounds purchased by the Secretary of the Interior for a penitentiary building.

§ 1. Section 158 of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota is amended to read as follows:
 § 158. No lands, other than those granted for the use and benefits of the common schools, shall be sold for less than appraised value, and in no case for less than \$5.00 per acre. The purchaser shall pay one-fifth of the price in cash, and the remaining four-fifths, at the option of the purchaser, in not more than twenty years, with interest at the rate of not less than six per centum, payable annually in advance. All sales shall be held at the county seat of the county in which the land to be sold is situated; and shall be at public auction and to the highest bidder, after sixty days advertisement of the same, in a newspaper of general circulation in the vicinity of the lands to be sold, and at the seat of government. Such lands as shall not have been specifically subdivided shall be offered in tracts of one-quarter section, and those so subdivided in the smallest subdivisions. All lands designated for sale and not sold within two years after appraisal, shall be re-appraised before they are sold. No grant or patent for any such lands shall issue until payment is made for the same, provided that the lands contracted to be sold by the state shall be subject to taxation from the date of such contract. In case the taxes assessed against any of said lands for any year remains unpaid until the first Monday in October of the following year, then and thereupon the contract of sale for such lands shall become null and void provided, further, that Section 16 and 38, or any indemnity lands selected in lieu of losses thereof, appropriated for the common school of the state shall not be sold for less than \$10 per acre.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

That Section 176 of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota be amended, by adding thereto and making part thereof, the following clause:
 The legislative assembly may further provide that grain grown within the state and held therein in elevators, warehouses and granaries may be taxed at fixed rate.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

Subdivision five, Section two hundred and fifteen (215), of Article nineteen (19), of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, is amended so as to read as follows:
 Fifth. The school for the deaf and dumb of North Dakota, at the city of Devils Lake, in the county of Ramsey.
