CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

The following proposed amendments to the Constitu-
tion of North Dakota, having passed the Seventh Legis-
lative Assembly, will be submitted to the Eighth Legis-
lative Assembly for approval or rejection:

Proposed Constitutional Amendment. Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

That subdivision 8 of Section 215, of
the Constitution of the State of North
Dakota be amended so as to read as
follows:

Subdivision 8. A state hospital for
the insane at the City of Jamestown,
in the county of Stutsman. And the
legislative assembly shall appropriate
twenty thousand acres of the grant of
lands made by the act of Congress
aforesaid for "Other Educational and
Charitable Institutions" to the bene-
fit and for the endowment of said insti-
tution, and there shall be located at
or near the City of Grafton, in the
county of Walsh, an institution for
the feeble minded, on the grounds
purchased by the Secretary of the In-
terior for a penitentiary building.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

That Section 176 of the Constitution
of the State of North Dakota be
amended, by adding thereto and mak-
ing part thereof, the following clause:
The legislative assembly may fur-
ther provide that grain grown within
the state and held therein in elevators,
warehouses and granaries may be
taxed at fixed rate.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment.

Subdivision five, Section two hun-
dred and fifteen (215), of Article nine-
teen (19), of the Constitution of the
State of North Dakota, is amended so
as to read as follows:

Fifth. The school for the deaf and
dumb of North Dakota, at the city of
Devils Lake, in the county of Ramsey.
