Then the Pioneer comes out and says if Griggs county delegates had not been too hasty everything would have been fixed satisfactory—to Steele county. Griggs county delegates are lucky to escape with their lives. Highway robbery from a political standpoint is what we term the action of Steele county, but then there'll come a time some day.
