The attention of the Board of County Commissioners having been called to the fact that the assessor of the town of Broadview have on the assessment lists for 1902 assessed improvements on real estate against the real estate and personal property both thereby making a double assessment of said improvements it was moved, seconded and carried that the following resolution be adopted.

Resolved that the County Auditor be and is hereby instructed to carefully go over said assessment lists and to compute the amount of said excess taxes, and to report to this Board at its next regular meeting, the names of all parties entitled to abatement and the amount thereof and in case the taxes shall have been paid the amount of the refundment each party is entitled to receive, for such action as this board may see fit to take.
