Notice to proper officers. Whire no physician is employed, it shall be school, jail, prison, hospital, asylum or other public or charitable institution shall give like notice of any birth, death, infectious or contagious disease occurring among the persons under his charge. Whoever neglects or refuses to give such notice within the period of twenty-four hours, or three days if outside of incorporated limits of cities, towns and villages as to births and deaths only, after the occurrence of such birth, death or infectious or contagious disease, shall upon-conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty dollars to be collected as other fines are collected by law.


