A Protest and a Warning.

Campers and visitors at Willow Lake are so notoriously abusing the privilege of entry accorded them by the land owners about this beautiful body of water that the undersigned have determined to no longer submit to the appropriation and destruction of their property by both the thoughtless and the ignorant. To Whom it May Concern.

Therefore we generally protest against the unconsidered violation of lands which are as strictly private as those of any reader's home.

We specifically protest against the destroying of trees by reckless gathering of fruit and nuts therefrom, by the building of fires thereunder and more particularly the tying of horses thereto.

We protest against the tearing down of our fences (it has been done within 80 days.)

We protest against the leaving open of private gates (it is done daily) by a public which has no right to be within them except on business or thru our courtesy.

We protest against the gathering of fruit, nuts and berries—without permission—and in such wholesale quantities as to leave none for actual owners; and we protest most strenuously against a few riotous crowds which make of the homes about the lake a place to be avoided on some Sabbath days.

Having stated plain undisputable facts, being led thereto by abuses of privileges which are little else than outrages, but hoping not to be obliged to exercise the unquestioned rights of our ownership, we hereby warn the general public that it will be absolutely excluded from the property held by us and bordering on Willow Lake if the violations of landed rights herein recited are continued.
